

### Student brags about killing cat: set social media on fire

On 7th February 2016, a student from Kasetsart University has set social media on fire after he posted the picture of the cat skeleton in the museum with the caption said “2 years ago many people said I was rampage but now my work is being showed in the museum PS. thank you to the cat from the grandmother next door who still cannot find her cat”.

There was a set of photos showing the process that he washed the carcass and deboned the cat carcass, which is very terrify. And also there was a picture of six dead rabbits with his caption that said he killed them by break their necks.

The people on social media (aka netizens) have shared the post and complained about his actions. The post spread very quickly as some famous pages in Thailand, such as drama addict, shared it.

The news went viral and brought animal lovers and activists to complain and criticise about how he killed the cat and still bragging around on his Facebook.

There was also a group of netizens who were supporting him. A person mentioned that the animal lovers do not understand the concept of “one for all”, without animal sacrificing, there will be no medicine for human.

The debate went on between the group of animal lovers who said it is not right to kill a cat, and the people who think that he just doing his assignment to turn in to his professor.

Some netizens have brought the information about his major area up. He is currently studying in entomology major which is the study of insects. In this track, students will be taught about the structure, types of insects, the way they live and also how to prevent

them from destroying plants. Therefore, an entomology student has nothing to do with the skeleton collection assignment.

Still many netizens were left curiously about the subject that requires students to kill animals for their bones.

There was a person who came up and informed netizens about this subject that it does really exist. But the students don't have to kill animals themselves, but they have to used already-dead carcasses.

After the news spread all over, Kasetsart University called this student for the investigation about what really happened.

It turned out that all of the post was just his lies. The situation happened few years ago in 2013, he was studying a subject called skeleton collection in his freshman year.

The professor gave students the rat carcass but

his group break it. So he has to find another carcass instead by using the cat that had been dead for 2 days.

But he posted in his Facebook and said he killed it, just to joking around. And the rabbits, that he mentioned he killed them, were died because a dog bite them, and again he just posted the picture and fooling around.
